ICE BREAKER:

READ:

Let's read 1 Peter 2:11-12 together.

Have someone read Acts 15:25-32:





What did Peter and the apostles start doing after being miraculously released from jail?

(They went right back to preaching and teaching the Gospel)

What were Peter and the apostles willing to risk in order to continue preaching the Gospel? (Freedom, Pain, Their Lives)

Acts 5:29 says, "Peter and the other apostles replied: 'We must obey God rather than human beings!'" How it is possible to obey God instead of others or ourselves? (The Holy Spirit is our Helper and Guide)

Have someone read Acts 5:33-42:

What's the difference between the rallies and revolts of Theudas and Judas versus the purpose and activity of Peter and the apostles?

How is it possible that Christianity and the Bible have survived and thrived for thousands of years?

Jeff and Colleen Letourneau shared the story of their marriage overcoming three divorce filings in the video testimony we watched on Sunday. They chose to live differently than the world told them to live.
