Mark said, "Sin is always the result of us trying to rescue ourselves. Sin happens when we put our trust in our own ability to do what is right." What do you think of this description of sin?

Mercy is something God gives when people are under the Law and when He withholds judgement. Mercy withholds judgement, but it does not change or alter the situation. Grace is a giver. Grace empowers and equips us. Another way to say it is, 'Grace is getting a gift we don't deserve, and mercy is not getting what we do deserve.' Grace gets us into heaven, and mercy gets us out of hell. Under Jesus we experience Grace!

Describe a time when you experienced grace – "getting a gift you don't deserve."

How did these experiences change your circumstances? Did they change you?
